

first aid kit checklist

Having a first aid kit for your dog is essential in case of an emergency, and it's best to have one readily available both at home and in your car to ensure prompt and effective care wherever you may be. Make sure everyone in the family knows where they're kept.

- Absorbent gauze pads
- Adhesive tape
- Antiseptic wipes
- Cotton balls or swabs
- Self adhesive bandage wrap rolls
- Ice pack
- Disposable gloves
- Scissors with blunt end
- Tweezers
- OTC antibiotic ointment
- Sterile saline solution for flushing eyes or wounds
- Emergency blanket (space blanket) for hypothermia or shock
- Plain diphenhydramine (please confirm your pet's dosage with your veterinarian)
- Phone number, clinic name, address of your veterinarian as well as local veterinary emergency clinics.
- Oral syringe or turkey baster
- Dawn dish soap (for bathing)
- Towels
- Small flashlight
- Alcohol wipes
- Styptic powder
- Saline eye solution
- Artificial tear gel
- Nylon leash

Make sure to check your kit every few months to make sure nothing has expired or needs to be replaced and of course keep your kit out of the reach of pets or children.
